Key experience:

Marian Zajko works with the Institute of Management of Slovak University of Technology (STU) as a Head of Dept. of Entrepreneurship Economics and Management and Deputy Director of this Institute. He gives lectures on courses Entrepreneurship in Small and Medium Enterprises (BSc level), Financial Management (MSc level) and Business Informatics and Entrepreneurship (MSc level).and tutored numerous MSc theses and PhD dissertations. In his teaching he draws on his previous extensive consulting and business experience in finance, controlling, IT and entrepreneurship and uses active learning methods. He closely collaborates with the STU Technology Incubator as a Chairman of the STU Business Plan Evaluation Board.

In July 2007 he participated in the European Entrepreneurship Colloquium on Participant-Centred Learning (EECPCL) at Harvard Business School. He also participated in several subsequent European Entrepreneurship Colloquia in Barcelona (2010) and Istanbul (2013) and in European Entrepreneurship Roundtables in Aachen (2008) and Budapest (2013) organized by European Foundation for Entrepreneurship Research (EFER).

In 2007 to 2008 he managed the development and operation of the e-learning project on Personal Management in Elementary and Secondary Schools in Slovakia (the ESF financing) where he worked as a tutor as well. The result of the project were some 2 000 school teachers and managers certified in Personal Management.

His research interests cover Entrepreneurship in SMEs, Financial Management, Management Information Systems and lately also Innovations Management. He published papers on these topics in international conferences in Slovakia, Czech Republic, Romania, Russia, Germany, South African Republic, Namibia, China and India, gave lectures on Entrepreneurships to students at the Leiden University (Netherlands, 2009)). He took part in the international ERDF project "Centrop_e_tt"(2009 to 2012, 16 partners from 4 countries) as a co-developer of the on-line course „Centrop_e_tt Academy“ certified by the European Certification and Qualification Association (ECQA, 2012) on training of cross-border managers of technology and innovation transfer within the Central European (Centrop_e) Region. He is also a certified trainer in this course. He has been member of the Scientific Committee of the International Conference on Engineering and Business Education (ICEBE), the Editing Board of the professional STU quarterly „Transfer“ on technology and innovations transfer. In the period from 2008 to 2012 he acted as a Host of Global Entrepreneurship Week in Slovakia and represented Slovakia in the Global Entrepreneurship Congresses in Dubai, Shanghai and Liverpool.
